BOSTON WARM: A CALL TO ACTION

In this cold and holy season we ache for the homeless people of Boston who are suffering as a result of the abrupt closure of the Long Island Bridge.

Working with service providers and city officials, we have identified a critical, unmet short-term need: day shelter with storage facilities. The Day Center will provide warm and comfortable space as an alternative to the streets. Operating from January 19th to March 31st, open five days a week, 8am to 3pm and centrally located in a Boston Church, we are working quickly to get it up and running. Follow our progress:
